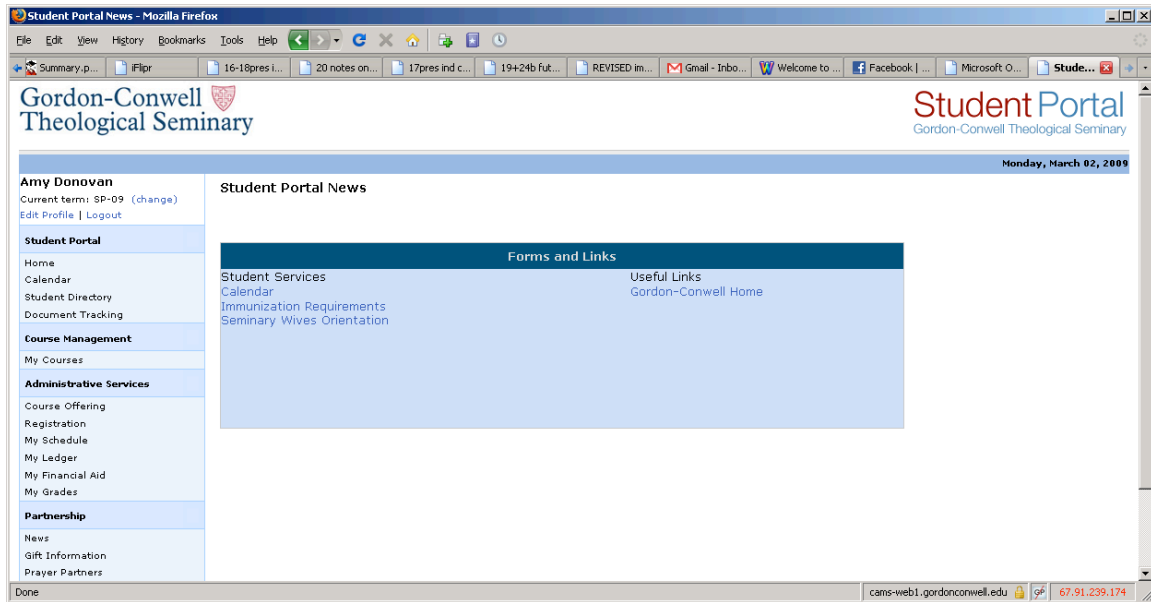
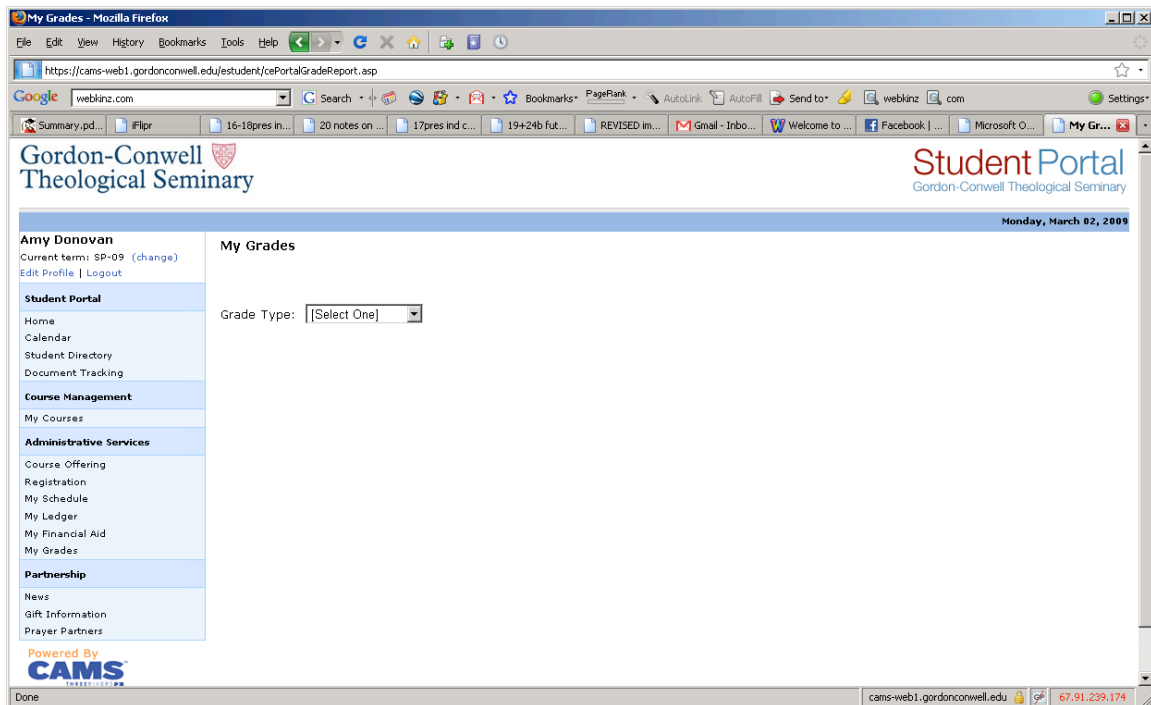


CAMS Student Portal Online Course Evaluation
