### What have you been doing since you left Gordon-Conwell?

After graduating in 2019, our family returned to Albania where we serve in full-time ministry at a local church. I recently opened a Christian counseling center that employs three licensed Christian counselors and a Christian psychiatrist. I am privileged to have wonderful people who are offering me extraordinarily competent supervision so that I can continue licensure procedures in the US.

### What do you love about your work?

I am glad that the person I am as a Christ-follower, pastor's wife, mom, friend, daughter, and sister adds to this work of counseling. I am thankful that the gifts and talents with which God made me are like a hand and glove with counseling. I enjoy that my life experiences are entwined in this amazing work of counseling. I appreciate the co-work aspect of counseling with others who have a calling in this work as we encourage one another to more excellence in our profession and support one another's growth. I love journeying with others as they grow and heal, realizing that they are a part of my journey as well.

### What are the particular challenges of serving as a therapist in your context?

Perhaps the most stark challenge is a lack of resources. The lack of translated instruments for evaluation, thorough supervision for new counselors, and resources like occupational therapy is noticeable here.

## How has God woven together your Gordon-Conwell education with other life events to bring you to where you are now?

God is a master-weaver. He brought all the events of mission and life and ministry to a fruitful and exciting place before allowing my husband and I to enjoy the profit of a GCTS education. The MACC program has an excellent professorship with people of multiple life experiences, including missional contexts and an assortment of ethnic and family heritages. This makes them
