On March 29, 2023, Dr. Crawford Loritts spoke for the Pastor's Forum, titled: "Resilience: Finish Your Course." The event focused on the reality of the presence of God and Christian identity. With an emphasis on the call to finish the good race, Dr. Loritts with humor and compelling urgency called students, church leaders, and faculty members to faithful service.

After a morning symposium for pastors held on the South Hamilton campus, the forum continued into the Wednesday Chapel, followed by a lunch discussion in the Alumni Hall. All who attended were encouraged and inspired by the message on 2 Timothy 1:3-7 to resilient leadership.

Dr. Crawford Loritts is the former senior pastor of Fellowship Bible Church in Roswell, Georgia, visiting professor at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, and a board member of several organizations, including Cru, FamilyLife, and the Gospel Coalition.

This work contains reflections from Todd's former students, colleagues, family, and friends on what it means to both "walk the walk" and "talk the talk" of global Christianity. Many of the authors who contributed to the Festschrift were in attendance, as well as Dr. Johnson's family who flew in to surprise him for this wonderful event.

Pastors in Cohort B, GCI Korea

GCI KOREA

The GCI Korea inaugural cohort was launched this past fall.

The thirty students are now in their third quarter of the one-year competency based program. They have completed modules with GCTS faculty Dr. Scott Sunquist, Dr. Eun Ah Cho, and Dr. Jeffrey Arthurs. They will soon finish a module with Dr. David Currie and begin work on their individual capstone projects where the leaders will integrate, contextualize, problem-solve and put in praxis what they have learned.

The next in-person communal learning opportunity is April 24-25. This initial cohort has thrived learning from trusted

advisors while forging strong life-long relationships with fellow leaders. Among the thirty participants in the program twenty-four plan to continue studying in the GCTS D.Min Korea program.

Moreover, for the next school year, GCI Korea plans to continue its student recruitment. The registration period is from January 3 to April 30, and the program allows up to thirty graduate students who have at least over three years of ministry experience.

GCI Korea continues to reach new and larger audiences through advertisements, newsletters, and outreach via social media.
