



**HISTORY** The Jacksonville campus of Gordon-Conwell was founded in 2006 at the impetus of a committee of alumni pastors and other church leaders in the area who wanted to bring Gordon-Conwell’s mission to full-time workers in ministry and the marketplace. Initially an extension site of the Charlotte campus, Gordon-Conwell—Jacksonville is now the seminary’s fourth campus, extending our commitment to educational innovation, academic rigor and faithfulness to the gospel.

The Jacksonville campus graduated its first class in 2010 and continues to grow as we train students to think theologically, engage globally and live biblically in every sphere of life.

**FINANCIAL AID** Each student at the Jacksonville campus receives a significant reduction in tuition costs. In addition, we offer a variety of scholarships, including the full-tuition Partnership Program and a flat-rate tuition package.

**ACADEMIC PROGRAMS** Nearly 40 percent of Gordon-Conwell students pursue the Master of Divinity (M.Div.). Classes at our Jacksonville campus are offered on weekends, evenings and in one-week intensives. Students preparing for pastoral ministry can earn the M.Div. degree entirely through weekend classes. Additionally, Gordon-Conwell offers a distance education program through which students can take a portion of the course requirements for the M.Div. and Master of Arts (M.A.) degrees.

**MENTORED MINISTRY** Each M.Div. student gains practical ministry experience through a mentoring relationship with a ministry leader. This internship instills a growing passion for ministry and develops the skills necessary for faithful Christian service.
